a Word From our Pastor

Love is in the Air or Are Those Ashes?

alentine's Day is on its way, as we are made well aware of by the end of December, as Christmas gets moved out and the red hearts and glitter gets moved in! This year, Ash Wednesday falls upon Valentine's Day, February 14th. Some clergy have lightheartedly mentioned doing the ashes in the shape of a heart instead of a cross. This caused some conversation among the group as some thought that was a terrible idea and that we should only celebrate Ash Wednesday and totally ignore the "Hallmark holiday". While others remarked that doing a heart on the forehead is not far offbase, as we Christians are supposed to be known by our love. I found this conversation interesting. First, Valentine's Day was not originally a "Hallmark holiday" but was once based on an actual Saint Valentine. Some of us may remember when it was called St. Valentine's Day. However, St. Valentine is no longer recognized in the Catholic church, due to a lack of historical evidence to point to the accuracy of why they were canonized, and which Valentine (there were two) was THE actual saint. And, yes, I really did dig into the research about the validity of the Feast of Saint Valentine, recorded in the Gelasian Sacramentary all the way back in the 8th century, but was established in AD 496. Unfortunately, *spoiler alert* none of it actually leads to any of the Valentines' (it was a common name) being involved in love in any way, as all the evidence points to the romantic stories contributed to them as untrue. It is true that Valentine was martyred in Rome in AD 269, but, he was not martyred for marrying couples, or delivering love letters to those imprisoned, nor did he find love with his jailer's daughter and sign his final note to her with love, your Valentine. He was taken to the gallows, though (both that were immortalized).

Now that we got that out of the way.....

hile I will be using a cross as the symbol for Ash Wednesday, I must say that doing a heart is not offensive to me. Why? Because God is love. His love for us is shown in his creation of us, where he placed his love. His love is shown through the gift of his son, Jesus Christ, and by the actions of his son. If it weren't for the love of God, we would not be here. If it were not for the love of God, we would not know of love, be able to be loved, or to give love to others. It is only because of God that we have the ability to comprehend (albeit minutely) the meaning of love. And even then, we muck it up. We take it for granted. We put limitations and

conditions on what we think love is or should be. But that is not God's way. God's love is AGAPE love. Agape love is the highest form of love; the kind of love and action that shows empathy and care for others without needing anything in return. It is unconditional and even sacrificial. It is intended for everyone. It goes beyond philia love, which is brotherly love, or the kind one has for a friend or family member. And it is higher than the passionate type of eros love that is shown to our significant others. We are called to love God above all, and next to love our neighbors, but both are done in agape love. This type of love is explained best in 1 Corinthians 13:1-10 (NIV)

13 If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

8 Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. 9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part, 10 but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. 11 When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. 12 For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

13 And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

ndeed, the greatest is love. This is the kind of love God created. This is the kind of love he expects us to give our all to being and doing. This is why a heart would be totally appropriate on Ash Wednesday as we recall the one who created us and what he created us for. What will it be for you? A cross or a heart?
